

## ACADEMIC PROBATION BASED ON PROGRAM RECOMMENDATION

Programs are responsible for monitoring the academic progress of their students, including through annual academic reviews. Factors that a program may use to assess academic progress include, but are not limited to, performance in course work, satisfactory and timely completion of all milestones as determined by the program, satisfactory progress in research, overall graduate and/or program GPA, and performance on qualifying, preliminary, and other examinations. When students fail to meet these requirements, a program can recommend to the Graduate College that the student be placed on probation or dismissed (dropped) by the Graduate College. To recommend that a student be placed on academic probation, complete this form and attach the following items:

- A letter from the Executive Officer or Director of Graduate Study that describes the academic progress concerns and provides information about how these expectations have been communicated to the student
- Copy of the most recent annual academic review for the student
- Copies of departmental handbooks, letters/emails about expectations or other items that show how the department has communicated expectations to the student
- Implications on funding of probationary status

GRADUATE COLLEGE SIGNATURE:

Following submission to the Graduate College, the entire package will be provided to the student, who will have an opportunity to provide a written response before the Graduate College will make a decision on the academic standing.
