Home of all students admitted to graduate studies at Illinois

- Jurisdiction over approved programs leading to graduate degrees
- Responsible for developing and safeguarding standards of graduate work
- Promoting and assisting in the advancement of scholarly activities in all fields



Graduate College 101


- All graduate students belong to the Graduate College
- Department rules cannot contradict Graduate College rules, but can be more strict or limiting.
- For example, minimum cumulative GPA
 - Graduate College = 2.75
 - Some departments require 3.0 or 3.25

Understanding Roles and Authorization

The **Executive Officer** for a unit, typically the head of the department, designates Authroized Signatories using the Graduate College Roles & Access Manager.

An **Authorized Signatory** for a unit can sign one or more of the types of forms listed below, depending on which roles they have been assigned. Roles include Director of Graduate Study (DGS), Graduate Program Contact, Graduate Admissions Contacts, and Departmental Degree Certifiers. Please note that role assignments are for the entire academic year, August to July and may require training. Graduate Programs are contacted in August to update roles for their unit. To see who in your unit serves in these roles, login to the Graduate College Roles and Access Manager at the link below.

Getting Started

- Connect with other campus colleagues in your role
- Work closely with the Director of Graduate Studies
- Consider joining Illinois Graduate Professionals Association (iGPA)
 - Monthly meetings and listserv
 - The list homepage: https://lists.illinois.edu/lists/info/igpa



Fostering Community

- Grad students typically feel more attached to their departments than campus at large
- Are there opportunities to bring students together and foster networking?
 - Orientation
 - Graduate Student Appreciation Week
 - Department seminars/colloquia
- Departmental student groups



Setting Expectations

- Explicit expectations
 - Clearly stated verbally and in writing (including handbooks)
 - Opportunity to ask questions and check for understanding
- Implicit expectations
 - Unstated assumptions that are not understood widely or consistently
 - Potential barrier to student success
 - Consider ways to make implicit expectations explicit



Conveying Expectations

- Use departmental and Graduate College policy to assist students
 - Mention these resources at orientation?
 - Use them in communicating with students (via email, meetings)?
 - Make these resources easy to find on web pages
 - Does the department send emails with reminders during key points of the semester?
- Keep in mind: departmental policies differ across campus



Working With Students

- It's the student's degree and their responsibility
- Explain expectations, policies, processes
- Consult with the DGS
- Reach out to the Graduate College Student Services Team
- Take care of yourself
 - Consider setting walk-in hours
 - Create boundaries



Navigating Challenges

- Disagreements and confusion can occur
 - Is there an internal process for managing?
 - Work closely with the DGS
- If challenges arise, the Graduate College can work with departments, the DGS, and students to navigate next steps
 - Reach out to <u>gradsuccess@illinois.edu</u>
- Make referrals to other campus units if necessary
